cape town, south africa

- Cape Town is a melting pot of many cultures: it was settled by Indonesia, France, Holland, Britain and Germany, and is home to the local Khoisan (San and Nama) and Bantu tribes from the north.
- The city's style is as diverse as its citizens: the Dutch influence is still afoot and can be seen in stone floors; gorgeous beadwork in vibrant colours speaks to the influence of indigenous African tribes.
- The poverty and harsh realities of life in Africa have generated unexpected and striking results: marketplaces overflow with handicrafts made from recycled materials. "South Africa is a country where time is one of the only free commodities, giving rise to beautiful needlework, among other crafts," says Denise Zidel of Toronto's Snob.
- Antwerp was the home of Flemish baroque master artist Peter Paul Rubens.
